WARNINGS

- Breast implants are not considered lifetime devices.
 The longer patients have them, the greater the chance they will develop complications, some of which will require more surgery
- Breast implants have been associated with the development of a cancer of the immune system called breast implant—associated anaplastic large cell lymphoma (BIA-ALCL). This cancer occurs more commonly in patients with textured breast implants than smooth implants, although rates are not well defined. Some patients have died from BIA-ALCL
- Patients receiving breast implants have reported a variety of systemic symptoms, such as joint pain, muscle aches, confusion, chronic fatigue, autoimmune diseases, and others. - Breast reconstruction. This includes primary reconstruction to replace breast tissue that has been removed due to cancer or trauma or that has failed to develop properly due to a severe breast abnormality. Breast reconstruction also includes revision surgery to correct or improve the result of a primary breast reconstruction surgery

CONTRAINDICATIONS

Breast implant surgery should not be performed in:

- Women with active infection anywhere in their body
 Women with existing cancer or precancer of their breast who have not received adequate treatment for those conditions

Possible adverse events with breast implant surgery include implant rupture with silicone implants, implant deflation with saline-filled implants, capsular contracture, reoperation, implant removal, pain, changes in nipple and breast sensation, infection, scarring, asymmetry, wrinkling, implant displacement/migration, implant palpability/visibility, breastfeeding complications, hematoma/seroma, implant extrusion, necrosis, delayed wound healing, infection, breast tissue atrophy/chest wall deformity, calcium deposits, and lymphadenopathy.
